Deductibles

A health insurance deductible is a specified amount or capped limit you must pay first before your insurance will begin paying your medical costs.

Some plans do not have a deductible for brand medications, but many plans do.

Deductibles affect most patients in Q1 and Q2.

For example, if you have a \$1000 deductible, you must first pay \$1000 out of pocket before your insurance will cover any of the expenses from a visit. It may take you several months or just one visit to reach that deductible amount.

At the beginning of the calendar year, patients with plans that include deductibles for brand medications are more likely to have a high deductible. This means the patient will pay the prescription's full cost upfront until the deductible is met.

Deductibles are not affected by the quantity of the product.

After the deductible is met, the patient may still be responsible for paying a copay or coinsurance until the yearly out-of-pocket maximum is met.
